



## Cheryl Ann Goin

June 5, 1954 - November 12, 2020

CLIFTON - Cheryl Ann Goin, 66, passed away Thursday, Nov. 12, 2020, in a Fort Worth hospital.

Cheryl was born at All Saints Hospital in Fort Worth on June 5, 1954. As it turns out, she was the "Lone Texan" in her family as the five other members were born in Arkansas.

Cheryl was a very proud Texas native, and loved to tell others of her home town.

She started life in the suburb of Haltom City, Texas and attended Special Education classes at numerous schools in Birdville ISD, eventually receiving a graduation certificate from Richland Hills. Later she took some courses at TCU and TCJC, including, speech, geography, first-aid, ADL, and tennis lessons. During this time, she became an avid TCU fan, wearing TCU ball caps and t-shirts much of the time, even throughout her adult life. Cheryl loved sports, including bowling, tennis, golf, and Dallas Cowboy football. One of her yearly highlights was when the Wimbledon tennis tournament started each year in England. She would be glued to the tv set rooting for her favorite players, and letting the chair umpire know when he made a bad call.

She and her mom were longtime members of the Birdville ARC, and loved to bowl. Her bedroom contained over 50 trophies for her efforts. She also enjoyed the Texas Special Olympics and competed in several events received. She received numerous medals and ribbons through the years.

With her dad being a certified Red Cross worker in Fort Worth, Cheryl wanted to do that also. She took some classes in first aid and lifesaving, and carried a Red Cross bag with first aid books in it with her almost everywhere. She displayed a sense of concern for others' well-being and always wished them to get well.

Upon the death of her father in 2002, it became necessary for Cheryl to enroll in a residential program through the Texas MHMR. She was admitted to the residential and vocational program offered by Newstart Inc. of Fort Worth. She lived and worked in this program for 15 years until she needed more individual care due to declining health. She became a resident of Cherokee Rose Rehabilitation and Nursing Center, Glen Rose, Texas in 2017 and enjoyed her time there. The family is extremely grateful to the Texas MHMR agency, Newstart Inc, and Cherokee Rose for the special care they gave.

In November 2020, Cheryl came down with pneumonia and was taken to a Fort Worth

hospital for care, and then moved to another local hospital's ICU. After about a week, her overall health faltered and her systems started to shut down. She passed peacefully from this life on November 12, 2020.

Cheryl was preceded in death by her parents, John M. Goin and wife, Ann of Haltom City; one brother, Larry Goin, of Granbury, Texas.

Survivors: Brother, Jerry Goin and wife, Barbara of Granbury; brother, John A. Goin and wife, Lori of Clifton, Texas; many nieces and nephews, along with great-nieces and great-nephews.

Due to the current covid virus situation, a family graveside will be held at Holly Hills Cemetery, Granbury, Texas, with Rev. Al Munger will be leading the service.
