FORT WORTH - Dorothy "Dot" Carole Ewing Keeton passed away Sunday, Nov. 29, 2020.

Dot was born in Polk County, Iowa Dec. 8, 1928, to Frank and Ruth Ewing. She had an older brother, Merrill, who predeceased her in 2013. She grew up on a farm and attended a one-room school. Dot eventually attended Iowa State University to study art. This is where she met her future husband, Jack Keeton. They were married in 1948. She and Jack raised three girls and two boys. They lived in Iowa, Kansas, Ohio and New Jersey before settling in Fort Worth, Texas in 1974. They were members of the First Presbyterian Church and loved to attend operas, theatre, concerts and art museums together.
