He was a dedicated member of First Baptist Church of Lakeside and was an active member of his Sunday school class. He called members that were sick to encourage them and called everyone in the class to remind them of time changes to set their clock back/forward.

He was preceded in death by his father, Theodore Mason; mother, Nellie Mae Mason; sisters, Ginger Kelly and Bobbie Webber; brother, Charles Richard Mason; and son, Brian Penn.
