Jerry was born on February 7, 1930 in Lebanon, Oklahoma, to James Vern and Oma Mae Everitt.

Jerry married her true love, Norris White, on January 8, 1955. Jerry and Norris bought their first home in Haltom City, Texas in 1958, and lived there until Norris died in 2017.

Jerry retired from Lennox Industries after 22 years of service. She was a member of Victory Baptist Church for close to 60 years, where she served in the children's ministry for close to 40 years. In 1988, she worked with Norris teaching the Evangelists Class. She had a great time with the older people where she ministered to them, to the sick and shut-ins. Jerry loved to sing and used her voice to glorify the Lord. She sang solos, duets, sang in quartets and the choir anywhere she was needed and had the voice of an angel.

Jerry was the consummate hostess, or as some called her "the hostess with the mostess" always making sure everyone had plenty to eat and drink when they were at her house. She loved catering to her family and friends, especially her children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren. She was the perfect example of a wife, mother, grandmother and great-grandmother.

After her husband's death in 2017, she moved to a memory care facility in Waxahachie to be close to her daughter where she lived until her death. Even with dementia she was always a sweet loving person to everyone she met.

Jerry was preceded in death by her parents, James Vern Everitt and Oma Mae Everitt; her sisters, Jan Griffin Putnam, Helen Dulaney, Della Bryant and JoAnn Gilbert; and her brothers, Charles Everitt and Patrick Everitt.
