



## John Steven Scott

January 17, 1969 - November 30, 2018

BENBROOK - John Steven Scott, 49, went to be with his Savior on Friday morning, Nov 30, 2018, after a courageous battle against ALS FTD.

John, Steven to his family, was born on Jan. 17, 1969, to John and Carol Scott in Wichita Falls, Texas. John grew up in Wichita Falls, Texas, where he met his wife of 30 years, Luanne Michelle Lee Scott. The teen sweethearts were married on April 7, 1988. That same year, John enlisted with the United States Army and was deployed to Dahrn, Saudi Arabia, for Operation Desert Storm. There, John served with the Patriot Missile battery as a telecommunications specialist. He remained on active duty with the Army for eight years, until 1996. Upon leaving the Army, John continued his work in telecommunications for the next 22 years as service manager and business partner at Crosspoint Communications which designs and maintains mission-critical communication systems for 911 responders in Texas, Colorado, and Arizona.

John enjoyed music, photography, skiing and travel. He and Luanne were active members in Westworth Village Baptist Temple in Westworth Village, Texas, for 22 years. John played guitar and other instruments with the worship band there. He was learning to play the banjo when he became ill. He loved Jesus and enjoyed participating in visitation and outreach with his church. Sharing the love of Christ with others was a passion for John.

A devoted and caring family man, John loved spending time with his best friend and wife, Luanne, and their children, Megan and John Steven, Jr. He was especially proud of his little granddaughter, Evelyn, (7). His family adored him, and he took them on vacations and skiing trips where he delighted in taking photos and video, creating special memories his family will take comfort from and cherish always.

In May of 2017, John was diagnosed with ALS FTD as a direct result of combat exposure during Desert Storm. Like every challenge John had ever encountered, he faced this one head on and stood firm in his faith in God and his love for his family, providing a role model of courage and endurance to all of his family and friends.

He was preceded in death by his father, John Edwin Scott of Wichita Falls; paternal

grandparents, James and Zelda Mae Scott; and maternal grandparents, Gail and Kathryn Mitchell all of Breckenridge, Texas.

Survivors: Wife, Luanne; daughter and son-in-law, Megan and Michael Trevino; granddaughter, Evelyn Trevino; son, John Steven Scott, Jr., all of the greater Fort Worth, Texas, area; mother, Carol Mitchell Scott of Wichita Falls; younger brother and sister-in-law, Damon and Chandra Scott of Henrietta, Texas; and their daughters, April Rehkemper and husband, Michael and son Larson of Plano, Texas; and Beth Scott and Laura Scott of Wichita Falls; and a large and loving extended family of aunts, uncles and cousins who loved him and will miss his sparkling blue eyes and ready laugh.
