NORTH RICHLAND HILLS - Lloyd Darrell Robinson was born on May 16, 1939 to Lloyd W. and Hilda Ann (Hammock) Robinson in Sheridan, Ind. Lloyd married his wife, Patricia, on Aug. 28, 1960. He was a beloved husband, father, grandfather, great-grandfather and friend to many people.

His first career was spent in the U.S. Air Force where he served 22 years protecting our country. He worked in Special Forces which included special assignments with the Army and the Navy and with the government of Turkey. He was stationed in Okinawa, Guam and Turkey and had several assignments in the continental U.S. One of his final special assignments was heading up security for the Prince of Iran in the late 1970's.

Lloyd spent over 40 years as a Master/Responsible Plumber. He was passionate about the integrity of his work and held true to the highest standards. He especially had a soft place in his heart for the elderly and others who were struggling. He made a point of taking time to share his love of Jesus over a cup of coffee with anyone interested.

Wherever he went on a service call, people knew to have a pot of coffee on for him. Many times, conversation and coffee were the only payments he took for his services. Lloyd volunteered his time through the Birdville ISD Business Partnership program where he spoke often to classes about having a career in plumbing and mentored students.

He was also a member of the Northeast Tarrant County Chamber of Commerce where he helped tirelessly with fundraising through the Denim and Diamonds Silent Auctions. He was a volunteer member of the city of North Richland Hills Construction Board of Appeals for many years. His generosity was evident in the work he did for Women's Haven of Fort Worth where he donated a lot of his time and plumbing skills throughout his career. He coordinated donations of over \$65,000 worth of plumbing supplies and labor to Women's Haven when their new center was built.

He also collected and took clothing donations to them regularly throughout the years. Lloyd was a collector of cook books and loved creating innovative and exotic recipes. He worked tirelessly in his yard creating a beautiful haven for birds, plants, flowers, and our family where we can sit and listen to the music of his wind chime collection. He was an avid supporter of the 2nd amendment and a proud life-time member of the National Rifle

Association. He took protecting his country and his family very seriously.

He was preceded in death by his parents; and sisters, Jackie Colbert and Connie Robinson.
