“ Allen Paul, Joanna and Family---Circumstances prevent me from being with you as you lay Aunt Kathleen to rest, but my heart, my prayers and my deepest sympathy are yours in these sad days as you make preparations, and in the days beyond. She was there in my parents' home the day I was born, in the middle of a February ice storm in Oklahoma, because when it became apparent that Mom couldn't be taken to the hospital in Ardmore, Aunt Kathleen came to assist the midwife, if needed. All the sisters-in-law, wives of the 6 brothers, helped each other as best they could in those years right after WW2 when times were hard and they were all scrabbling to put their lives back together. My mom and dad held her in high regard, as did all the others, and even though contact was infrequent over the years as the brothers went in different directions, that regard never wavered.
