FORT WORTH - Consuelo Patricia "Paty" Munoz passed away on the beautifully sunny afternoon of Wednesday, Dec. 16, 2020, at Harris Methodist Hospital due to complications from Covid-19. Her life was celebrated at her passing with applause and song to let those who receive her know that they are better for her and that we have lost a truly rare, wonderful human being.

She was born in Mexico City, Mexico on May 9th, 1960. It was in Mexico City where she would become the childhood sweetheart of Jose Penaloza, the man she married in 1986. She studied agronomy at the prestigious Universidad Nacional Autonoma de Mexico before emigrating to the United States to join her parents.

She was a long-time resident of Fort Worth. It was there she raised her daughters while working any and every job she could find as a young immigrant, from cleaning toilets at a nightclub, to making windows; to managing a food pantry, to being a caretaker for young and old alike. That spirit of taking care of people was a defining characteristic of hers, and one she brought to American Airlines where she worked at the Southern Reservations Office for 25 years.

During her time there she did everything from picking up clients from the airport who did not have a ride, to facilitating the escape of a young woman who was being trafficked, to assisting families of victims and first responders during the 9/11 attacks, and more. No matter what it was, her constant refrain was, "it only took some extra time, how could I not help?"

Paty loved traveling and adventures. She wanted to climb Mount Everest. She loved everyone she met. She dedicated her life to helping and lifting others and thought of everyone before herself. She was taken too soon and will be mourned by many, but her legacy is undeniable to any who were privileged to know her. God sometimes sends angels to live among us as an example of how to live our lives, then he calls them home. Such was Patricia.

Patricia was preceded in death by her father, Fidencio Munoz.

She is survived by her husband; daughter Danaydae Lara O'Neal and her husband Zachary Richard O'Neal; Danaydae's father, Manuel Lara; daughter Dulce Penaloza;
