



Truett Reed Hampton

July 22, 1927 - September 22, 2018

FORT WORTH - Truett Reed Hampton, born July 22, 1927 in Temple, Okla., went home to be with the Lord on Sept. 22, 2018, from Kennedale, at the age of 91 years. He was known by many as T. R. or Reed Hampton.

Officiating Reed's home going service is Pastor, Richard Tosh, of Eastside Baptist Church, Fort Worth, and oldest grandson, Jeff W. Hampton, pastor of Rendon Baptist Church.

Reed Hampton, who lived in Haltom City, was a long-time member of Eastside Baptist Church of Fort Worth, under the pastorate of Rev. Richard Tosh.

Early in life, Reed became a brakeman for the railroad in Fort Worth. He later decided there was a better way to provide for his growing family by owning his own business, a rendering truck company, with at times, several employees and trucks.

Reed accepted Christ as his personal Savior at an early age. Later in life, as a member of Dickson Street Baptist Church, under the ministry of Rev. Marvin Kemp, he served as song leader and youth director. In time, the Lord placed a call on his heart and he soon surrendered to the ministry. He was called to Denton, where he pastored Bible Baptist Church of Denton.

Feeling the need to grow in God's Word and instruction, he attended Trinity Valley Baptist Seminary in Kennedale. Working during the day and attending the seminary at night, he continued until he graduated. In August of 1966, he was officially ordained to the ministry by a Council of Baptist Churches of the Independent Fundamental Association.

Eventually, Reed was called to pastor at the church where he had surrendered to the

ministry, Dickson St. Baptist Church in Fort Worth, where he remained for numerous years.

Reed was not afraid of hard work and even in his latter years remained strong and determined. He had a great sense of humor and loved to tell a joke or story, especially with his grandchildren and at the Hampton Family Christmas gatherings. Having come from a family that loved to sing gospel music, he enjoyed singing and listening to the hymns and gospel songs. He passed this love on to each of his children, who continue to sing the songs of the Lord to this day.

Reed was a provider and protector of his family and a faithful friend to many. Although he wasn't one to verbalize his feelings, his actions always told you of his love.

Reed's love for the Lord and unique personality endeared him to many. He led his family and others to know more about the Lord and things eternal. As a believer in Christ, and as a minister of the Word of God, his desire today would still be for you to know the Lord as your personal Savior and be assured of the way to heaven.

Reed Hampton is preceded in death by his father, Jessie Lee Hampton and mother, Mamie Lee Latham Hampton, of Keller; brothers, Alton Hampton, Marvin Hampton, George Hampton, Freddie Hampton, Mickey Hampton, Jack Hampton and his wife Pat; and sister, Loyce Thurman.

Reed is survived by Valerie Hampton Wiggins and their three children; son, Toby Hampton and wife, Joyce, of Kennedale son, Mark Hampton and wife, Lisa of Kennedale; daughter, Tami Hooper and husband, Rick, of Ocala, Fla.; eleven grandchildren; 22 great-grandchildren; as well as many friends and family.
